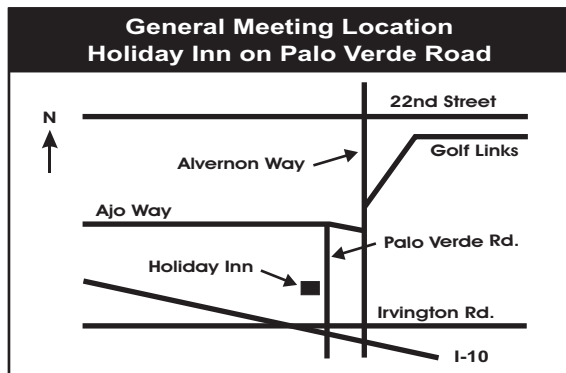

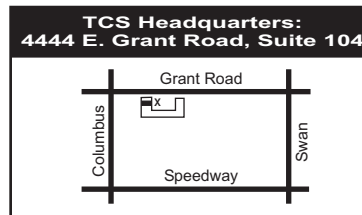
## Special Interest Groups (SIGs)
